Autumn 1 Curriculum letter

Ourselves / Where have all the flowers gone?

This half term we will be covering 2 mini topics all about change, change in ourselves as we grow from babies to adults, and seasonal changes in the environment.

Literacy

This half term we will be looking at lists, labels and captions. We will also be reading stories with familiar settings such as 'Titch' and 'Funny Bones'.

We will be learning to:

- Composing a sentence orally before writing
- Re read what we have written to check it makes sense
- Build on our knowledge of simple punctuation
- Use our phonetic knowledge to help us to spell



Numeracy

We will be learning to:

- Record using marks
- Order numbers correctly and say which numbers are missing
- Recognise, use and count numbers to 100
- Order objects by direct comparison
- Recognise and describe 2D shapes

Science

In science this half term we will be looking at growth human body and seasonal changes in the environment. We will:

- Discuss how animals including humans have offspring that grow into adults
- Describe the importance of being healthy
- Identify, name, draw and label the basic parts of the human body and say which part of the body is associated with each sense.
- Observe changes across the four seasons
- Observe and describe weather associated with the seasons and how day length varies


ICT

- Communicate ideas by selecting and adding text
- Enter and store information in a variety of forms (for example, storing information in a prepared database, saving work)
- Using the interactive whiteboard and a digital camera

- Collect autumn leaves to draw or rub
- Make collage pictures using materials they have found in the woods
- Recognise shapes in the home. Take photographs and identify the shapes
