



## **1940s Military and Civilian Vehicle Parade Entry Rules**

### Rules of Entry

- All vehicles must display a unique registration number on their windscreen – this will be issued on the day and must be displayed throughout the parade and under no circumstances be removed.
- Filling or emptying of fuel tanks within the area is strictly prohibited at any time
- All vehicles should be positioned within the boundaries of the display so that any protrusions, doors, tail lifts etc do not infringe public access
- Vehicles must be appropriately taxed and drivers be insured to drive the vehicle.
- Applicants must ensure all drivers hold, and are not disqualified from holding, a licence to drive the class of vehicle being displayed in the procession.
- Road vehicles must be fully licensed and tested in accordance with the regulations for that type of vehicle.
- Parade will start at 7pm
- No exhibit may be left running unattended. All unattended vehicles must be securely braked and/or chocked and engines switched off.
- No vehicles may run on trade plates.
- All vehicles are accepted into the show on condition that the authorities and the show organisers cannot be held responsible for exhibitors/negligence involving damage or injury to vehicles or persons. Similar for loss or theft of vehicles, contents and equipment.
- It is the responsibility of the exhibitors to ensure that all vehicles being driven have a minimum third party insurance cover. Road traffic act rules apply on site.
- No dangerous dogs allowed on site. Pets are the direct responsibility of their handlers and must be kept on a leash at all times, and any deposit to be cleared up.
- Whilst every effort is made to ensure a successful show the organisers accept no responsibility for weather, show attendances and reserve the right to close down the procession at any time should circumstances beyond our control necessitate such actions.
- Exhibitors must pay full regard to marshal's instructions and conduct themselves in a manner that will not inconvenience or endanger other persons at any time.
- Applicants wishing to display a military vehicle with any form of weapon must include a copy of the deactivation certificate with this application form for consideration of approval.
- All entrants assemble on Station Rd Car Park at 6.30pm and must then return to Station Road Car Park at end of parade
- Drink driving laws apply and police will take action against offenders.



## RAFT RACE APPLICATION FORM

- Please arrive and meet with rafts on the Prom outside Ellie's Cafe by 10am on the day. Please use the ramp by Fisherman's Slope. Please check in with a Carnival Official in a Fluorescent Jacket. You will receive a Race Number when you have checked in. You will need a Race Number to take part.
- All rafts must have a maximum of four over 17s on board. However rafts can be built by any number of people, including under 17s. All crew members will be required to register their names and sign a disclaimer on the day.
- All rafts should be constructed to withstand the elements of the sea and for the safety of your crew. On arrival at the start site your craft will be inspected by the race organiser to ensure that it is seaworthy. The raft must have a towing point with a tow rope attached and it may be prudent to bring extra lashings/buoyancy in case alterations are required on site.
- The organiser reserves the right to stop any raft entering the water if it is deemed unsafe to do so
- All competitors on the raft must wear buoyancy aids/lifejackets whilst the raft is in the water. You are required to supply these and they must have a minimum buoyancy of 60N and this will be checked prior to the race. You may use safety equipment provided by the Carnival Committee and must wear it correctly in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions.
- Each team member must be able to demonstrate, to a suitable competent person, their ability to swim 50 metres in clothing and equipment appropriate for the raft race. Where a buoyancy aid or lifejacket is worn for the activity, this must be used for the demonstration. Anyone unable to meet these requirements is classified as a non-swimmer. Non-swimmers will be unable to take part.
- No alcohol will be consumed on the raft at any time, or by the crew members in the day leading up to the race.
- Safety/marshal boats will be on the scene throughout the day.
- NO throwing of objects will be allowed at any point during the race, either at the rafts or into the public crowd. Failure to abide by this rule will result in expulsion from the event.
- The race organiser will advise you of the course on the day.
- Competitors must have minimum self rescue knowledge and skills. Each team member must be able to climb onto the raft unaided and have aggressive and passive white water swimming ability.
- If a raft is asked to stop or help with a situation, this must be obeyed. There will be a captains meeting prior to the event. Any team ignoring race or safety officials or showing disregard for their own or others safety may be disqualified from the event.
- On finishing the course you will be asked to beach your raft in a specific location. It is your responsibility to remove and dispose of your raft sensibly. Norfolk County Council will charge you for the removal of any debris/rafts that are not cleared away.
- An area of the beach will be cordoned off for the safety of the public
