
# Loire

The Loire Valley Vineyard stretches from the west coast Nantes area with its bone dry, sea-fresh Muscadets, through to Central Loire also known as France's garden with sweeter Vouvrays and dry fruity Touraine Sauvignon. From there it flows to the Upper Loire, the Central Valley - almost in the centre of the country – and home to the villages of Pouilly Fumé, Sancerre and Menetou-Salon, with their superb minerally, flinty wines. The area is the biggest producer of white wine in France, and produces 20% of all the country's wine. The UK is the biggest export market for the Loire region and the wines are perfectly suited to the abundance of fresh fish and seafood found on menus across the South West.

## Chereau Carré, Loire Valley

With 300 acres of Melon de Bourgogne Chéreau-Carré is the biggest producer of Muscadet in the Sèvre-et-Maine area. The family became famous in the area in producing high quality Muscadet. The property is managed by Bernard Chereau, whose family origins span back to the 11th Century. Bernard is constantly innovating and seeking to show off the incredible sites of his Domaine. The Château l'Oiselinière de la Ramée is a single vineyard with an exceptional Terroir of schist and a great south exposure. The wine produced is very mineral with a good balance between acidity and fruit and flowers aromas. The range is completed with a large selection of Loire Valley wines from Touraine Sauvignon, Vouvray and Rosé d'Anjou. The wines have been rewarded regularly by international press.



## Sauvignon de Touraine, Domaine des Caillots, Chereau Carré



This dry white wine has a bright colour and fruity (peach, lychee) and floral (acacia) aromas which are found again on the palate, where its plumpness and expressiveness are surprising: the balance between the roundness and the zest is perfect. (1) 12.5%vol.
